<u>Multiple Choice:</u> There will be ten (10) multiple choice questions. Please choose the best answer for each question. This section should take approximately five to ten minutes to complete. Each question will be worth one point, and this section will be worth 1/6 of your total exam grade.

<u>True-False Questions:</u> There will be ten (10) true-false questions. In order to prevent disputes over hand-writing and the similarities between the letters t and f, all answers must include the full word "true" or "false." This section should take approximately ten minutes to complete. Each question will be worth one point, and this section will be worth 1/6 of your total exam grade.

Matching Questions: There will be ten (10) matching questions. Please choose the best answer for each question. This section should take approximately five to ten minutes to complete. Each question will be worth one point, and this section will be worth 1/6 of your total exam grade.

Topics that may appear in these sections of the exam: parliamentary procedure, parts of position and resolution papers, structure and functions of the parts of the United Nations, and the origins and history of the UN.

Essay Question: Two essay prompts related to our discussion of the global issue of poverty will appear on the exam. You will choose one and answer it as completely as you can. There is no set length requirement, however, your essay should include AS A BARE MINIMUM a thesis statement and multiple supporting paragraphs. As this is a time-limited exam, formal introductory and concluding paragraphs are not required. This section will be worth 30 points and will be worth 1/2 of your total exam grade.
